The Department of Psychological Science at Central Connecticut State University (CCSU) generally supports the Transfer Pathway from Connecticut State Community Colleges to the completion of a B.A. in Psychology at CCSU as set forth in Template 1. Specifically, assuming no changes in the degree requirements for a B.A. in Psychology at CCSU, and assuming that no courses need to be repeated due to poor grades or withdrawals, and assuming that resources are provided to the Department of Psychological Science at CCSU such that an adequate number of sections of the required courses can be offered, the program of studies as delineated in Template 2 could be completed by full-time attendance (i.e., at least 15 credits per semester) for two years.
