1. HIST 445 European Ideas and Culture, 1750-1918 3

Prereq.: HIST 301 or permission of instructor. Main currents of European thought and culture from 1750 to 1918. Irregular. [GR]

2. HIST 446 Ideas and Culture in Europe, 1918-Present 3

Prereq.: HIST 301 or permission of instructor. Main currents of European thought and culture from 1918 to the present. Irregular. [GR]

3. Master of Arts in History: Electives in history or related fields (6 credits)

The fields of concentration available in the M.A. program are U.S. history, European history, and comparative world history. No more than nine credits can be taken at the 400 level.

Although proficiency in a language other than English is not a program requirement, students should be aware that it may be necessary for certain research subjects.

B. The committee tabled the course revision of HIST 482: The Polish-American Immigrant and Ethnic Community, because there was no signed curriculum form.
