Undergraduate Course Addition: IS 420 – Government and Politics of Latin America

Motion to approve cross listing IS 420 with PS 420 and IS 421 with PS 421 and reaffirm for I status approved pending the addition of the following language in the IS and PS courses passed unanimously. (Smith/Miller)

## General Education Survey

The Committee reviewed a draft of a survey designed to garner faculty feedback on the current General Education program and to develop a framework for future General Education revisions. The Committee suggested revisions to the survey and expressed interest in reviewing the varied models of General Education utilized at other institutions of higher education. Robert Wolff indicated that he would develop a blog where faculty could post suggestions and comments about the General Education Program and any potential reform.

The Committee also suggested that students might appreciate the opportunity to contribute to the discussion of General Education as well.
