A. OLD BUSINESS

1. The committee approved as revised the course addition of COMM 586: Graduate Field Studies in Communication in the Communication Department. (Glynis Fitzgerald, Representative)

a. Revision for COMM 586: Graduate Field Studies in Communication

b. Delete the word "normally" from the course description.

B. NEW BUSINESS

1. The committee tabled the course addition of CM 615: Advanced Construction Law in Manufacturing and Construction because there was not a representative from the Department present at the meeting.

2. The committee approved as revised the course revisions for RDG 503: Developmental Reading in Primary Grades, and RDG 506: Developmental Reading in the Secondary Schools in the Reading and Language Arts Department. (Ken Weiss, Representative)

a. Prereq. Revision for RDG 503: Developmental Reading in Primary Grades

Prereqs: Open to sixth-year, MS, or OCP in Reading and Language Arts, or by permission of the chair of the Department of Reading and Language Arts.

b. Prereq. Revision for RDG 506: Developmental Reading in the Secondary Schools

Prereqs: Open to students in post-baccalaureate certification programs, or permission of department chair.

3. The committee approved as revised the course addition of MUS 569: Aural Skills Development for Teachers in the Department of Music. (Carlotta Parr, Representative)

a. Course Description Revision for MUS 569: Aural Skills Development for Teachers

b. Aural skill development, and proficiency in areas of musicianship including sight-singing, dictation (melodic and harmonic), error detection; and their application to the music classroom. Open to any music educator with a Bachelors degree in music. Irregular.
