New Business:

1. Review and comment on the report and proposal from the Ad Hoc Committee on Four Credit Courses:
 - a. Concerns include:
 - i. The possibility of increasing the total number of credits students may need for graduation (“credit creep”)
 - ii. Transfer students may not have the same depth of coverage when transferring a three-credit course from another institution and applying it to a four-credit course at CCSU.
 - iii. Four-credit courses should be reserved primarily for upper level courses.
 - iv. The potential impact on accreditation of potential changes to courses in the business program.
 - b. A potential beneficial use of the four-credit model is to convert core courses to four-credits in order to incorporate a common theme such as ethics and social responsibility. The department could manage transfer students by setting up one three-credit course to cover the add-on material in the special topic area.
