<b>3.1</b>	<p><b>Program revision</b></p> <p>The following modification is need to the MS in Reading and Language Arts which is offered to teachers in Jamaica. The Jamaican Ministry of Education has a requirement of 36 credits for a masters degree. This proposal is to add additional 12 elective credits to the 24 credit core courses to meet this requirement. 4.1	Change all instances of “School of Arts and Science” to “College of Liberal Arts and Social Sciences”	AS SEPS SEST Bus GR GenEd
4.2	Change all instances of “School of Engineering and Technology” to “School of Engineering, Science, and Technology”	AS SEPS SEST Bus GR GenEd
4.3	<p>The following revision is by request of the Registrar’s office, with a request to clarify timeframes for implementation of approved curriculum changes. . It would be useful to add language about the effective term of course changes (fall to fall, spring to spring) since this has been a long standing practice necessitated by the course scheduling timeline. 	<p>during the fall semester become effective in the next fall semester. Course changes approved by the Curriculum Committee and the Faculty Senate during the spring semester become effective in the next spring semester.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>2. Program changes must be approved by the Curriculum Committee and Faculty Senate no later than March to become effective the following fall and to be included in the next published catalog. Program changes that required external approval (<i>BOR, NEASC, etc</i>) become effective the next fall semester after receiving external approval.</li> <li>3. Exceptions to these timetables may be made if there are documented extenuating circumstances if approved by the Curriculum Committee Chair and the Vice-President for Academic Affairs.</li> </ol>	
4.4	<p>The current bylaws imply that “minor” changes apply only to courses, and not to programs. This means that anytime a course number or course title is changed, and that course is explicitly listed in a program, we must then do a separate program revision to incorporate the change into the program.</p> <p><b>Current bylaw: 4.9.</b> Procedures for effecting minor changes:</p> <p>4.9.1. Requests for a change in the designator, number, title, cycling pattern and/or description may be submitted to the appropriate Dean(s) for approval provided that the essential nature of the course is not changed.</p> <p><b>Proposal:</b></p> <p>4.9.1. Requests for a change in the designator, number, title, cycling pattern and/or description may be submitted to the appropriate Dean(s) for approval provided that the essential nature of the course is not changed. <i>Minor program changes will be allowed in cases of a change in designator, number, or title of courses listed within that program as a consequence of course revisions, but only if those changes do not change the essential nature of the program.</i></p>	<b>AS</b> <b>SEPS</b> <b>SEST</b> <b>Bus</b> <b>GR</b> <b>GenEd</b>
4.5	<p>Section 5.3.1 defines the structure of the General Education Subcommittee. The current structure includes a separate representative from the School of Engineering and Technology so as to ensure at least one representative from each school, but now that the Math and Sciences have moved into SEST, representatives of SEST will now be included in the Study and Skill areas. The proposal is to remove the separate SEST representative. In addition, the senate has created a new committee on international education whose bylaws state that they will advise on Gen Ed International courses, so a representative of that committee should be added to Gen Ed ex officio.</p> <p><b>Current Bylaw:</b></p>	<b>AS</b> <b>SEPS</b> <b>SEST</b> <b>Bus</b> <b>GR</b> <b>GenEd</b>
