4.33	Program revision	Delete program Political Science Minor There are 3 changes to the minor. First, we are adding the requirement that students must take 6 credits at the 300-400 level. It is possible, currently, for a student to graduate with a minor without taking a 300 or 400 level course and we wish to curb that impulse. Required Courses: At least 15 credits in Political Science, 6 credits of which must be at the 300 or 400 level. Second, we are adding language on the outside credits to parallel the existing language in the major. Electives:	CLASS

Third, we are removing the last sentence that makes no sense in the context of the current program. Credit for not more than 6 credits towards a political science minor may be granted, with approval of the department chair, from those areas listed as options under the major.
