4.0 APRIL AGENDA DISCUSSION

My current thinking is that if a course was last offered in 2014 or earlier, we ought to at least consider deleting it in our April round of meetings. They should be on the agenda for deletion in April. However, the committee may wish to change the criteria in advance of the April meeting.

CRITERIA: We will discuss the criteria. We will NOT discuss individual courses on the list this month, just the criteria by which we select items for the list. Once criteria are agreed to by the full committee, the list will be generated for the April round of meetings. If we pick 2016 as our cutoff, then all courses offered prior to 2016 would be on the agenda.

If a course ends up on the list for the April agenda a motion to separate it from the list will be in order in the appropriate subcommittees followed by a vote by the subcommittee to keep. If that passes, the course will come to the full committee, either on the consent agenda or as a separate item. Which it is depends on agreement between the subcommittees, see below. If it fails, it goes back on the list (again pending agreement between subcommittees).

PROCESS: An ART course* with GenEd credit, for example, would go to CLASS subcommittee and the GenEd subcommittee. If those subcommittees agree (either to delete or keep), then the course will come to the Main meeting on the consent agenda. It can be pulled from the consent agenda and voted on separately at the Main meeting with a motion and second. If subcommittees disagree about removal, it will come to Main as a separate agenda item to be considered by the full curriculum committee.
