Motion to approve resolution from several departments reaffirming desire to remain in Arts & Sciences school (Spector/Mahony)

“Whereas rumors persist about the movement of science and math departments out of the School of Arts and Sciences,

Whereas some former members of the Department of Biology have moved to the School of Technology, and established the Department of Biomolecular Sciences,

Whereas, the faculty of the Department of Chemistry have indicated their intention to move from Arts and Sciences to Technology, and

Whereas the members of the Departments of Biology, Computer Science, Mathematical Sciences, and Physics and Earth Sciences, collectively the vast majority of basic science and math faculty at CCSU, have repeatedly expressed the view that the most appropriate home for them is in the School of Arts and Sciences,

Be it therefore resolved that the Senate supports the said four departments in their intention to remain in and to be fully supported in Arts and Sciences and calls for full and open consultation with the members of those departments and the Senate prior to and during any consideration of a change in their status.”
