Presented here is the proposals that was considered and approved by the Academic Standards Committee at our February 22<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

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### **Certificate in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies**

To be eligible for a Certificate in Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies a student must be in good standing. Courses taken to satisfy major requirements may be counted to satisfy certificate requirements as well, provided the student has earned a C- or better in such courses.

12 credits, with at least 6 credits at the 300-400 level, distributed as follows:

WGSS 200 Introduction to Women, Gender, & Sexuality Studies (Study Area III)

WGSS 400 Feminist Theory

and 6 credits from any of the following: ANTH 350; COMM 380; COMM 435; CRM 330; ED 550; ENG 215; HIST 330; HIST 331; HIST 334; HIST 335; ISCI 118; PHIL 222; PS 241; PSY 430; PSY 448; PSY 571; SOC 212; SOC 240; SOC 350; SOC 445; WGSS 215; WGSS 222; WGSS 240; WGSS 241; WGSS 288; WGSS 330; WGSS 331; WGSS 334; WGSS 335; WGSS 350; WGSS 390; WGSS 430; WGSS 435; WGSS 448 or WGSS 469. As identified in the academic catalog, no credit will be given for students taking the same course under its cross-listed designation. Additional courses, such as special topics courses, can be used with prior approval from the coordinators for Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies.
