Report of Ad-Hoc Committee

The Faculty Senate established the Ad-Hoc Committee on General Education in October 2010 (see Faculty Senate Motion 10.11.007B). The members of the committee are as follows:

- Robert Wolff (A&S, History)
- Mary Anne Nunn (A&S, English)
- Tim Reagan (SEPS, Teacher Education)
- Olga Petkova (SOB, MIS)
- Paul Resetarits (SET, Manufacturing and Construction Management)
- Thomas Burkholder (A&S, Chemistry and former chair of Curriculum Committee)
- Rachel Siporin (A&S, Art)

The Senate asked the Committee to ascertain "whether there is a need and/or desire to redesign the General Education program at CCSU." To that end, the Committee conducted an electronic survey (see copy attached) on December 6-13, 2010. The CCSU President's Office distributed the survey via email to all Academic and Administrative Departments in the University. The Committee received 230 responses to this survey.

Overall, 61.3% of respondents (141/230) agree or strongly agree that the General Education program should be re-designed. Looking more closely at AAUP Full-time faculty, those most responsible for the content of General Education, 65.6% (109/166) agree or strongly agree. These results are detailed in the table below. The Committee also reviewed 137 responses to an openended question about General Education included in the electronic survey. <u>Based on the results of this survey, the Committee believes that "there is a need and/or desire to redesign the General Education program at CCSU."</u>
