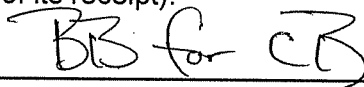

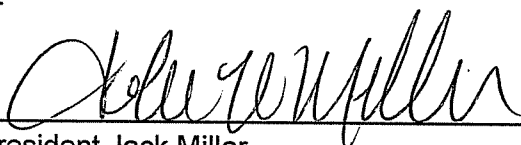

Academic Standard Committee
CIEE Affiliates

On October 25, 2011, the Academic Standards Committee discussed the issue of academic transcripts from CIEE affiliates. As it now stands, when students take study abroad courses through CIEE, they are required to pay a \$350 fee to Spelman College before they receive credit for the work and the classes appear on their records. This is a burdensome amount for college students. Many other universities accept the CIEE Academic Record as proof of credit transferability. The committee agreed that the fee of \$350 is not necessary and passed a motion to abolish it, accepting CIEE Academic Records as proof of credit transferability.
