In-Residence Credits and Grades for CCSU's Approved Overseas Programs MOTION AND RATIONALE

Background

Central's approved study abroad programs (see reverse side), which have always been designated in residence, currently treat courses taken abroad as transfer credit on students' CCSU transcripts. Although the credits earned on these programs count as residency credits (NOT transfer credit), the grades earned on these programs are recorded as "TR" and do not tally into the GPA. This creates the anomaly illustrated in the example below):

Motion

The following motion will address this anomaly by treating enrollments in approved study abroad programs like all other courses with the same status.

Coursework completed abroad at CCSU's approved study abroad partner and affiliate institutions shall be treated in the same manner as coursework undertaken on the CCSU campus. Grades earned will be posted on the student's transcript and calculated into the overall GPA. These courses are now considered "in residence."

NOTE: This motion applies only to undergraduates who attend one of CCSU's approved overseas programs. Students who opt to attend a non-approved program will continue to be required to take a leave of absence from the University, forfeit financial aid, and earn transfer credit for the coursework.

Rationale

- 1 CCSU's approved international partnerships and affiliates (see reverse) have been:
 - reviewed and approved by the Connecticut Attorney General for Central students
 - initiated, promoted, or overseen by CCSU faculty
- 2 Approved programs have high minimum GPA standards for application (see reverse).
- 3 All CCSU financial aid travels with students who attend approved overseas programs.
- 4 Prior to departure, students must have all credits pre-approved by CCSU department chairs and the faculty advisor. Courses count toward CCSU's major, minor, and General Education requirements
- 5 Parity with Hartford Consortium enrollments
 - Grades earned at Consortium schools tally into the CCSU GPA
 - Consortium credits count as in residence, not transfer
- 6 Academic equity and rigor
 - Students will know that grades of D and/or F will be recorded on the transcript (now these are omitted).
 - Students who receive financial aid will have full-time enrollments displayed on the transcript (now the transcript only shows courses with grades of C- or better).
