## A Resolution of the Central Connecticut State University Faculty Senate in Support of Representation and Voting Rights For Part-time Faculty at Department Meetings

- Whereas part-time faculty are teaching large numbers of courses at Central Connecticut State University; and
- Whereas academic department meetings are a major conduit for both faculty input, governance, and for the dissemination of information to faculty; and
- Whereas academic departments have been inconsistent as to whether part-time faculty are invited to meetings, and have access to agendas and minutes; and
- Whereas academic departments have been inconsistent as to whether part-time faculty have input into departmental decisions by means of voting representation at department meetings; and
- Whereas a lack of communication to part-time faculty, and a lack of input from them, hinders their ability to carry out the decisions and policies put forth by their departments; and
- Whereas shared governance works best when all teaching faculty are included in the informational processes of their departments;
- Therefore, be it resolved that the Faculty Senate recommends part-time faculty should be more fully integrated into the informational structures of their departments in the following ways:
  - Departments should consider having at least one voting member representing the
    part-time faculty at each department meeting. This member should be elected by the
    part-time faculty in the department. Larger departments should consider some form
    of equitable representation. Part-time faculty may not vote on issues such as the
    evaluation of tenured and tenure-track colleagues, etc. They should, however, be able
    to vote on all other issues relevant to their roles as teaching faculty.
  - Part-time faculty should have access to agendas and minutes for their department
    meetings in a timely manner, by having these materials posted to the department's S:
    drive or otherwise disseminated. Keeping part-time faculty informed of departmental
    activity is absolutely essential for a cohesive department.
  - Academic departments and all other relevant bodies at Central Connecticut State
     University should modify their department bylaws and other foundational documents
     to reflect the inclusion of part-time faculty in department meetings and governance.
