## CCSU School of Business Proposed Change to the School of Business Admissions Requirements

In May, 2014 the Faculty Assembly of the School of Business voted to replace Stat 201 with MC 207 in the list of pre-major classes to be used for full admission into the School of Business. (See <a href="http://web.ccsu.edu/sobusiness/admissionsInfo.asp">http://web.ccsu.edu/sobusiness/admissionsInfo.asp</a>.)

The eight pre-major classes are currently Eng 110, Math 123 or 125, Econ 200, Econ 201, Stat 200, Stat 201, AC 211 and AC 212.

We propose to change them to Eng 110, Math 123 or 125, Econ 200, Econ 201, Stat 200, MC 207, AC 211 and AC 212.

There were two primary reasons for the change: (1) We felt our requirements were heavy on analytical skills and we wanted more of a balance with communications skills in our requirements. (2) The equivalent of Stat 201 is not offered at most if not all community colleges, so having that as a pre-major requirement prevented CC students from being admitted into the School of Business as Majors upon transfer. The change will streamline transfer, increasing the ability of Community College transfer students to complete their BS degree in two years.

Other than the substitution of MC 207 for Stat 201, the admissions requirements would be unchanged. The current same GPA and course grade requirements would remain in effect.

Stat 201 will still be required for all CCSU business majors, as it will be a prerequisite for many business classes including the MGT 480 capstone course that is required for all business students. Stat 201 will become a related requirement for all five School of Business Majors. We will encourage CCSU students to take Stat 201 in or before the first semester of their Junior year.
