## Impact of Increase in Minimal Enrollment for 100- & 200-level Summer Courses from Six to Eight Students

Report to Faculty Senate, March 14, 2016

- Overall Undergraduate summer enrollment, credit hours, and FTE increased slightly between 2014 and 2015
  - Headcount: 2,259 (2014) versus 2,281 (2015)—Up 1%
  - o Credit Hours: 10,369 (2014) versus 10,661 (2015)—Up 3%
  - o FTE: 691.3 (2014) versus 710.7 (2015)—Up 3%
- Class sizes for on-ground/online/hybird 100-level and 200-level courses remained essentially flat between 2014 and 2015:
  - o 100-level: Average class size of 14
  - o 200-level: Average class size of 12.5
  - Number of 100-level sections was the same in both years (78)
  - Number of 200-level sections increased by 9, (76 in 2014, 85 in 2015)
