Ms. Theodore explained that right now only students in upper level classes get the opportunity to try out their broadcast abilities, having a club would enable CCSU students to test out their skills in front of a camera sooner. The group plans to work with Darren Sweeney in journalism to facilitate use of the university studio at least once a week. Right now the group is an academic based student organization with interest in possible moving toward putting out a product sometime in the future. The product might be a CCSU news show or other type of student production. The committee asked about review of student content.

Ms. Theodore indicated that use of the studio at this point would require close work with faculty therefore allowing for criticism and critique. S. Sweeney pointed out that as a club if the group puts out a product (student run TV show)it would be wise for the group to develop and editorial process and a set of standards. As a club no prior review would be required. If the group ceases to be just an academic club and puts out a product they may become a media board member group. *Media Board membership is only available to media groups putting out a product on a regular schedule.* Though they are not eligible for Media Board membership at this time they are always welcome to attend Media Board Meetings.
