

Faculty-Student Research Proposals, 2016-17

Highlights

- 40 proposals were received (39 proposals received in 2015-16; 43 proposals received in 2014-15; 39 proposals received in 2013-14).
- 29 awards were granted (32 awards in 2015-16; 25 awards in 2014-15; 34 awards in 2013-14).
- There were 75 student applicants in 2016-17 (66 undergraduate and 9 graduate students). In 2015-16 there were 77 student applicants (65 undergraduate and 12 graduate students). In 2014-15 there were 76 student applicants (68 undergraduate and 8 graduate students), in 2013-14 there were 65 student applicants (53 undergraduate, 12 graduate).
- There was a total funding request of \$35,003 in 2016-17 (\$30,212.05 requested for 2015-16; \$40,041 in requests for 2014-15; \$34,286 in requests for 2013-14).
- The total amount awarded in 2016-17 was \$20,634 (\$19,660 awarded for 2015-16; \$15,647 in awards for 2014-15; \$22,917 in awards for 2013-14).

Funding summary

- In 2016-17, awards totaling \$16,642 were made to 24 undergraduate proposals, funding a total of 35 undergraduate students. Awards totaling \$1,500 were made to 3 graduate student proposals containing one student each. Awards totaling \$2,492 were made to two proposals containing a combination of 9 undergraduate and 2 graduate students.

In 2015-16, awards totaling \$15,241 were made to 21 undergraduate proposals (from a total of 53 undergraduate student applicants), awards totaling \$3,224 were made to 6 graduate proposals (from a total of 11 graduate student applicants), and two awards totaling \$1,195 were given to projects that included a combination of graduate (2) and undergraduate (3) students. In 2014-15, 20 awards totaling \$13,722 were made to undergraduate proposals (from a total of 39 undergraduate student applicants), 4 proposals from one graduate student each were awarded \$1,325, and one award of \$600 was given to a project that included one graduate student and 3 undergraduate students.

- In 2016-17 there were 11 non-funded proposals from a total of 21 undergraduate and 4 graduate student applicants. In 2015-16 there were 7 non-funded proposals from a total of 12 undergraduate applicants and 1 graduate applicant. In 2014-15 there were 13 non-funded proposals from a total of 21 undergraduate and 3 graduate applicants.
- \$15,000 available in new funding from the CCSU Foundation.

- \$5,825 carried forward in unspent funds from previous competitions.
