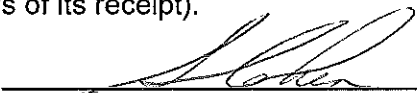

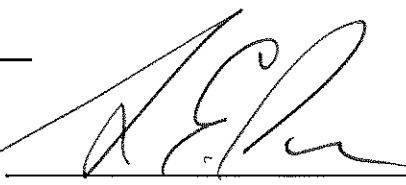

b. Minor changes:

- i. Regarding the Reading and Language Arts program: The Curriculum Committee recently (Spring 2016) approved the revised MS in Reading and Language Arts program (certification track). The revised program includes 600-level courses from our Sixth-Year degree in Reading and

Language Arts that the CSDE requires towards the Literacy Coach certification. In an effort to streamline our revised program, we changed the course code from RDG (Reading) to LLA (Literacy & Language Arts) and also the 600-level courses to 500-level courses. As a result, all of the 600-level courses that were changed to LLA 500-level courses were deleted from the catalog. We did not realize at that time that this change will impact our candidates in the 6th year degree program. Our Sixth-Year degree program requires a minimum of 15 credits of 600-level courses in both the certification track and the non-certification track programs for the certificate. Given the current changes, our sixth-year candidates are unable to meet this requirement.

- ii. We are requesting to bring back our 600-level courses and cross-list them with the appropriate LLA 500-level courses as follows:
 - 1. LLA 522 / RDG 694 Organization, Administration, and Supervision of Reading and Language Arts Programs 3 credits
 - 2. LLA 524 / RDG 696 Practicum for Reading Specialist/Literacy Coach I 3 credits
 - 3. LLA 526 / RDG 697 Practicum for Reading Specialist/Literacy Coach II 3 credits

2) 4-credit policy update: The Four Credit Courses Policy was approved by the Faculty Senate on Nov 25, 2013. As part of the policy, it was determined that “In the Spring of 2016 the Curriculum Committee shall review the conversions of 3-credit courses to 4 credits and make whatever recommendations to the Senate it sees fit.”
