





B) Change from ART 414 American Art

To Art 414 American Art & Architecture

Art 414 American Art is listed as an elective in the American Studies minor, so it would have to be changed to Art 414 American Art & Architecture there, too.

Change description for Art 216

From: Survey of rapidly changing artistic styles such as Post-Impressionism, German Expressionism, Bauhaus, and Surrealism within their historical context including major political events, such as World War I. We stop at Pop.

To: Survey of rapidly changing artistic styles such as Post-Impressionism, German Expressionism, Bauhaus, Surrealism, Feminist Art, and Activist Art within their historical context including major political events, such as World War I and World War II.

C) Geography: change of concentration: currently reads as “Environmental Geography.” Edit it to be “Environmental Geography and Sustainability.”

D) PHIL PHIL 443 would become “PHIL 497: Philosophy Thesis Preparation”

PHIL 441 would become “PHIL 498: Philosophy Thesis”

PHIL 442 would become “PHIL 499: Philosophy Thesis Completion”

E) For the OCP in Data Science, the original and curriculum-approved revision was 20 credits for program credit distribution and the number of credits already belonging in an approved program was 20. However, a student could choose courses that could result in 20 to 22 credits.
