I am currently a sophomore who is transferring after this semester, to pursue a major not offered at Central. If there is anything I will miss about CCSU, it would certainly be the professors. They have all been so understanding and adaptive with the current situation. All of my professors have made it clear that if anyone is facing challenges right now, whether that is from the virus or not, they should contact them and they will work together to get through this. For people with trying circumstances, professors are being cooperative in regards to grading fairly, so that the variety of disadvantages people face will not hurt their gpa.

It would not be fair to the people who have worked so hard all semester, if the grading is switched to pass/fail. It is well past the halfway point, so the majority of our grades have already been established. We paid for this semester under the impression that our grades would count, and our hard work would matter. I have just finished sending off my transfer applications, and put in a lot of effort to track down five different professors, and several administrators, to sign transfer mid term reports and a college report, all of which center around my grades. I have been stressed all year that something would affect my gpa, and this is certainly not what I had in mind after doing everything in my power to maintain high grades.

The majority of universities, and all of those that I applied to, do not accept transfer credit for classes taken pass/fail, which would essentially throw out the whole semester of time, effort, and money I have put in, and derail my graduation timeline. For anyone who plans to go to grad school, or apply for selective majors, specifically in the STEM field like myself, this will be detrimental for our applications and chances at our desired schools, regardless of what our performance in class was. Unfortunately, you cannot have a competitive application without hard, concrete numbers.

I appreciate the time you have taken to read this email, and hope that you consider the points I have made since this will continue to affect students for years to come as they apply to a variety of different programs and/or jobs.
