RESOLUTION OF SOLIDARITY WITH AAPI COMMUNITY

WHEREAS, the history of the United States of America includes many appalling examples of discrimination against persons of Asian descent, including the enactment of the Chinese Exclusion Act in 1882 and the internment of Japanese Americans during World War II;

and WHEREAS, because the SARS-CoV-2 was first identified in China, it has been used as a pretext by some for showcasing their prejudice towards persons of Asian descent;

and WHEREAS, over 3,800 incidents of hate toward members of Asian American and Pacific Islander (AAPI) communities have been reported to the website "Stop AAPI hate" in the last year alone, and these incidents include verbal harassment, shunning, and civil right violations, to physical attacks and recent shootings that killed eight people in Atlanta, Georgia;

and WHEREAS, no one in the United States of America should be subjected to discrimination in any form, as discrimination is antithetical to the principle that the country professes in its Declaration of Independence;

and WHEREAS, our university's website states that "Central Connecticut State University is committed to providing a safe and nondiscriminatory employment and educational environment", and that commitment stems from a recognition of the inherent dignity of every human being;

and WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of every member of the CCSU community to promote the principles of equity and inclusion that are embodied in the policies of the institution;

BE IT RESOLVED,

That the CCSU Faculty Senate abhors and condemns all instances of racism and discrimination, and in particular those targeting members of the Asian American and Pacific Islander community;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,

That the CCSU Faculty Senate stands in solidarity with all faculty and students of Asian and/or Pacific Islander descent, and enjoins all faculty, students, campus and system administrators, legislators, and government officials, to contribute to the creation of a safe, welcoming, and supportive environment for all members of the community.
