(b) Minor change to course description for MATH 547 (approved by relevant Deans)

MATH 547 Reflective Practice in Teaching Mathematics

Designed to help in-service teachers develop as reflective practitioners through the use of lesson logs, narrative commentary, analysis of videotaped lessons, and examination of student work. Emphasis on relating instruction to the big ideas of mathematics, designing appropriate assessments, and determining meaningful feedback for students. Particularly helpful to beginning teachers who will be compiling their BEST portfolios. Open only to certified in-service teachers of mathematics, grades 7-12.

New Course Description:

MATH 547 Reflective Practice in Teaching Mathematics

Designed to help in-service teachers develop as reflective practitioners through the use of lesson logs/journals, narrative commentary, and examination of student work. Emphasis on relating instruction to major concepts of mathematics and their connections, selecting and implementing engaging tasks including culturally relevant tasks, designing appropriate assessments and determining meaningful feedback for students. This course is particularly helpful to teachers who are completing the requirements of The Teacher Education and Mentoring (TEAM) Program. Open to certified in-service teachers.

Rationale:

- 1. The BEST portfolio in the current course description has not existed for over 10 years.
- 2. About five years ago we made a change to the MS for Elementary and Middle School Teachers to require this course, but we missed to change the description of the course to reflect the program change.
- 3. This course was taught using the new description for at least five years and this minor change is to correct the online description so that it coincides with our practice.
