The Faculty Senate endorses this letter.

Last week, the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals upheld a lower court ruling that found that that the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program is unlawful — while keeping protections in place for current participants. As a system of public college and universities that serves a large number of DACA students, we have a long history of advocating for the codification and expansion of the program. That's why I, along with the presidents of our institutions, have signed a joint letter to our congressional delegation supporting a long-term legislative solution for our undocumented students. Honorable Members of the Connecticut Congressional Delegation,

Last week's decision by the Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals to uphold the ruling in *State of Texas, et al., v. United States 2021* that the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program is unlawful is both disappointing and concerning to our DACA students and all of us as leaders of the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities.

While this decision continues to protect roughly 600,000 participants already in the DACA program while barring new applicants, it is the latest case adding uncertainty and doubt for our DACA students about the future of the program and their individual futures in the state of Connecticut. In the ten years the DACA program has been in place, more than 800,000 individuals have relied on it for work permits, deportation protections, and to pursue their higher education goals.

Even though the program has been robust and has provided valuable protections, it serves only a fraction of our students who were brought to the United States as children, known broadly as our Dreamers. Every year, nearly 100,000 undocumented students graduate from high school in the United States, yet only 25% are estimated to be eligible for the DACA program.

Our DACA students, staff, and our community of Dreamers more broadly deserve the protections, stability, and peace of mind to pursue their lives and dreams here in the place they have called home. We need a long-term, bipartisan, legislative solution for DACA recipients, other Dreamers, their families, the higher education institutions who serve them and the employers who rely on them.

As Presidents of the Connecticut State Colleges and Universities, we write to you today to urge all of you to work with your colleagues in both chambers and on both sides of the aisle to find a permanent solution and pathways to citizenship for these Dreamers and their families. We stand ready to provide

whatever information, expertise, or any other help we can to your offices in this effort.

Thank you for all that you do for our students, our institutions, and the communities we serve.
